## Judge's report, Syrian Classes, Brockholes 2 November 2024

Nice autumn day for our AGM Show. 50 Hamsters so not the largest show but some very nice hamsters and a really interesting mix of colours and standards that kept me reaching for my standards book to double check my memory!

**Golden Shorthaired M/F - 7 hamsters in class -** Several were quite faded and lacked the richness required of a golden. Only one was a youngster. Coats generally good. The winner a chunky golden female whose main fault was thin belly fur but an overall very nice hamster.

**Cream M/F - 7 hamsters in class -** Main points to note in cream class – some quite shaggy coats, uneven carrying down of coat colour e.g. pale tips, darker band, white at roots. Winner was a huge male, colour carried well down with nice type and decent broad well held ears.

**AOC Shorthaired male – 5 in class -** 2 yellows, a cinnamon, a copper and a melanistic yellow. Winner a nicely presented melanistic yellow beating a decent yellow and a cinnamon into 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places. He just lacked the amount of black ticking required by the standard but excellent under-colour. None of the animals were that large but had generally good dense coats.

**AOC Shorthaired Female – 7 in class -** First in class was a lovely rich yellow carried well down with the right amount of ticking – nice type and dense short coat. She went on to take Best in Show. Several of the yellows and the honey in this class had too heavy ticking which detracted from the overall appearance of the animal.

**Patterned Shorthaired M/F – 4 in class -** Interesting mix of patterns. Class winner was a nicely marked, well distributed spots, dominant spotted golden female. Lacked the richness of colour of a class winning golden but one of the nicest dominant spotteds I have seen for some time.

**Satin Shorthaired M/F – 3 in class -** Winner a nice typed, wide headed black-eyed cream. Coat lacked density but nice even rich colour. The 3<sup>rd</sup> placed golden satin is a promising youngster who I expect will blossom with age.

**Longhaired Cream M/F – 3 in class -** All females. Long coats but lacked density. Best was a nicely chunky typed black-eyed cream with reasonably even colour.

**Longhaired Self M/F – 1 in class -** Black longhaired female. Quite chunky but quite brown across a lot of the top coat.

**Longhaired AOC Male – 3 in class -** Winner a golden male – beautiful long coat all round the hamster – one of the best I have seen recently. Meant the richness of colour was lacking but a very good example of a longhaired male. The other 2 in the class lacked the length of coat.

**Longhaired Patterned M/F – 4 in class -** Winner a very good example of a banded pattern on a longhaired sable female. Nice chunky animal with a long coat albeit lacking some density. She went on to take Reserve Best in Show. Others were a decent band on a golden longhaired male and a sable roan male with a very nice long fluffy coat and a very chunky hamster.

**Longhaired Satin M/F – 1 in class -** Large golden satin male lacked richness even allowing for the long hair but good type.

Rex M/F – 3 in class - Winner was a lovely thick coated red-eyed cream male. Not quite as curly as I would have liked but a nice animal for future breeding.

We did notice a number of very yellowed and chewed show pens and we deducted a small amount for each – checking first if they were hire pens. A large number of pens were not labelled underneath which made this checking process laborious. Please do label your pens so we can be more efficient with checking this point in future.

Many thanks to Teresa Linford for acting as book steward – welcome back to the judging table Teresa. Also thanks to Catherine Mason for ably assisting us as pen steward – her first while she is now officially on the judge training programme. Also thanks to Liam Mason for acting as runner between the judging table and the Show Secretary.
